## Sunshine and Shadows





## In Your Pack:

You are given a set of black on white blocks and white on black blocks of different fabrics to use, as well as fabric to cut up for another block which will give you the same fabric for the black on white and white on black (i.e.

enough for two different blocks)

## Materials:

Black on White Print 1 x 3" square

3 x 2 ½" squares

White on Black Print 1 x 3" square

3 x 2 ½" squares


Please provide 1 x 2 ½" square of a bright fabric.

(Note: Please don't use white or black solids - it will spoil the effect)

## Method:

1. Make 2 Half Square Triangles (HSTs) using the 3" black on white and white on black fabrics. Draw a line diagonally from corner to corner on one 3" square. Draw a line a scant ¼" each side of the first line and sew a scant ¼" seam on both lines. Cut along the first line. Open the square out and press the seam toward the darker triangle.





- 2. Using the 45-degree line on your ruler, trim the HSTs to 2 ½" square.
- 3. Lay the 9 squares out to match the photo above. Using ¼ " seams sew together in three rows of three with the bright print in the centre.

Press the seams in the top and bottom rows toward the centre, and the seams in the middle row toward the sides of the row.

Sew the rows together, ensuring the seams line up. Press the seams toward the middle row.



4. Your block is now finished and should measure 6 ½" square including the seam allowance.
